As we experience colder weather, please keep in mind to give your space heaters room and do not plug them into a power strip as this may cause a fire. Winter is also a time to inspect your heating equipment and ensure it is fully operational and there are no issues that may cause you and your family harm. It is recommended, if you have not already done so, to inspect and ensure you have working smoke detectors on each level of your home and a working carbon monoxide detector in the home as well.

As we enter 2020, the Blue Island Fire Department is happy to announce the launch of a pilot program. Due

to the generosity of our Big Brothers to the north (City of Chicago Fire Department), we have obtained 70 smoke detectors for free and, we will be developing a program in conjunction with our City Leaders to distribute to those in need. We hope that this proves to be a worthwhile endeavor since we will have the opportunity to expand the program. Stay tuned for more information.
