AN ORDINANCE RESTRICTING PORTIONS OF CERTAIN STREETS FOR HANDICAPPED PARKING ONLY WITHIN THE CITY OF BLUE ISLAND, COUNTY OF COOK, STATE OF ILLINOIS, AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

WHEREAS, it is the public policy of the State of Illinois, as enunciated in the State Constitution, that handicapped persons are entitled to enjoy the fruits of a full and meaningful life; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Council of the City of Blue Island hereby declare that it is the public policy of the city to encourage and assist handicapped persons to participate fully in the social and economic life of our community; and

WHEREAS, to implement such policy the Mayor and City Council of the City of Blue Island recognize it is desirable to restrict certain portions of the public ways within the City of Blue Island for handicapped parking only;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Blue Island, County of Cook and State of Illinois, as follows:

SECTION ONE

That these portions of the streets within the City of Blue Island, as hereinafter designated, are hereby restricted for handicapped parking only:

- a) On the south side of 140th Street in front of the residence whose common address is 2837 W. 140th Street. (one space consisting of a total of twenty (20') feet)
- b) On the north side of Everett Street in front of the residence whose common address is 2912 Everett Street. (one space consisting of a total of twenty (20') feet)
- c) On the north side of 122nd Street in front of the residence whose common address is 2336 W. 122nd Street. (one space consisting of a total of twenty (20') feet)

d) On the west side of Artesian Avenue in front of the residence whose common address is 12252 Artesian Avenue. (one space consisting of a total of twenty (20') feet)

SECTION TWO

Appropriate signs shall be erected by the Superintendent of Public Works on the portions of the streets designated above informing the public that parking thereon is restricted or permitted as hereinabove provided for.

SECTION THREE

The operator of any vehicle violating or failing to comply with the provisions of this ordinance shall upon conviction be fined not less than Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00) nor more than Three Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$350.00) for each offense.

SECTION FOUR

All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION FIVE

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication in pamphlet form as provided by law. A full, true and complete copy of this ordinance shall be published in pamphlet form, by authority of the City Council as Corporate Authorities.

AN ORDINANCE RESCINDING RESIDENT PARKING ONLY RESTRICTIONS WITHIN THE CITY OF BLUE ISLAND, COUNTY OF COOK AND STATE OF ILLINOIS

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Blue Island, County of Cook and State of Illinois has determined that regulating vehicular parking on public streets presents a unique challenge;

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Blue Island, County of Cook and State of Illinois has determined that "Resident Parking Only" does not adequately address this challenge; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Blue Island, County of Cook and State of Illinois has determined that the public welfare requires the rescinding of "Resident Parking Only" restrictions.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Blue Island, County of Cook and State of Illinois, as follows:

SECTION ONE

That the Resident Parking Only restrictions presently in existence within the City of Blue Island, County of Cook, State of Illinois are hereby repealed and rescinded.

SECTION TWO

The Superintendent of Public Works shall remove all signs on the portions of any public street within the City of Blue Island that restricts parking for resident parking only.

SECTION THREE

All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION FOUR

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, approval and publication in pamphlet form as provided by law. AN ORDINANCE GRANTING A VARIATION TO THE BLUE ISLAND ZONING ORDINANCE OF 1971 AS AMENDED FOR PROPERTY WHICH IS LOCATED AT 12001 GREGORY STREET, BLUE ISLAND, ILLINOIS

WHEREAS, Jeffrey A. Atwell has filed an application seeking a variation to the Blue Island Zoning Ordinance of 1971 for the purpose of a constructing a six foot vinyl fence from the southwest corner of the lot (Public Alley and Gregory Street) running along the west lot line to the point of intersection with garage driveway; hence east to the southwest corner of the garage.

WHEREAS, the Zoning Board of Appeals has held a public hearing in accordance with Article VIII, Section 8.7 of the Blue Island Zoning Ordinance of 1971; and

WHEREAS, the existing zoning classification of the property in question is an R-1 Single Family Residential Zoning District; and

WHEREAS, Section 5.13 (2) of the Blue Island Zoning Ordinance prohibits fences in front yards for lots located in a R-1 Zone; and

WHEREAS, Section 8.7 (4) of the Blue Island Zoning Ordinance authorizes variations; and

WHEREAS, the Blue Island Zoning Board of Appeals has recommended that the requested variation be granted; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has determined that it is in the best interest of the Public and the City to permit the construction of the fence; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has found that the following conditions have been complied with:

(a) The property in question cannot yield a reasonable return if permitted to be used only under the conditions allowed by the regulations in the district in which it is located;

- (b) The proposed variation will not merely serve as a convenience to the applicant, but will alleviate some demonstrable and unusual hardship which would result if the strict letter of the regulations were carried out and which is not generally applicable to other property within the same district;
- (c) The alleged hardship has not been created by any person presently having a proprietary interest in the premises;
- (d) The proposed variation will not be materially detrimental to the public welfare or injurious to other property or improvements in the neighborhood;
- (e) The proposed variation will not impair an adequate supply of light and air to adjacent property, substantially increase the danger of fire or endanger the public safety;
- (f) The proposed variation will not alter the essential character of the neighborhood;
- (g) The proposed variation is in harmony with the spirit and intent of the Blue Island Zoning Ordinance; and

WHEREAS, The Zoning Board of Appeals has also recommended that a variation be granted in this specific instance for the property legally described as follows:

THE WEST 15 FEET OF LOT 16 AND ALL OF LOT 17 IN BLOCK 5 IN PATTERSON'S SUBDIVISION OF LOT 3, THE SOUTH 33 FEET OF LOT 2 AND THE NORTH 33 FEET OF LOT 4, ALL IN SOUTH WASHINGTON HEIGHTS SUBDIVISION OF THE NORTHWEST 1/4 OF SECTION 30, TOWNSHIP 37 NORTH, RANGE 14, EAST OF THE THIRD PRINCIPAL MERIDIAN IN COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Blue Island, County of Cook, State of Illinois, as follows:

SECTION ONE

That the recitals and findings set forth above and in the recommendation of the Blue Island Zoning Board of Appeals attached hereto as Exhibit "A" are incorporated herein verbatim and they are adopted as the findings of the City Council.

SECTION TWO

That a variation to the Blue Island Zoning Ordinance of 1971 is hereby granted to

Jeffrey A. Atwell to permit construction of a six-foot vinyl from the southwest corner of the lot

(Public Alley and Gregory Street) running along the west lot line to the point of intersection with
the garage driveway; hence east to the southwest corner of the garage.

SECTION THREE

That any and all improvements made to the subject real property shall be completed in accordance with all applicable zoning, building setback, building, fire and safety ordinances of the City of Blue Island and the specific conditions imposed in this ordinance.

SECTION FOUR

Jeffrey A. Atwell will only be permitted to construct a fence in accordance with the attached recommendation of the Blue Island Zoning Board of Appeals as amended.

SECTION FIVE

All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION SIX

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval as provided by law.

SECTION SEVEN

The City Clerk is directed to send a copy of this ordinance to the aforesaid applicant as notification of its passage and approval.

Application of Jeffrey A. Atwell requesting a variation for a fence (Section 5.13(2)) pursuant to Section 8.7(4)g of the Zoning Code for the premises located at 12001 South Gregory Street, Blue Island, Illinois.

A hearing by the Blue Island Zoning Board of Appeals was convened on November 21, 2011 at 6:00 p.m. concerning the above referenced application. The Zoning Board heard testimony and received evidence from the applicant, Jeffrey A. Atwell. Mr. Atwell presented a Plat of Survey, Exhibit "A", showing the legal description and dimensions of a single zoning lot. The subject lot is located in a R-1 Zoning District and contains a single family residence with an attach garage that faces the west lot line.

The subject lot is located on the southeast corner of the intersection of 120th Street and Gregory Street. The premises is a corner lot with a front yard abutting 120th Street on the north and a front yard abutting Gregory Street on the east. A public alley abuts the premises on the south. The south lot line currently has a six foot chain link fence. Mr. Atwell is requesting a variance to construct a six foot fence consisting of wood or wood composite from the southwest corner of the lot (Public Alley and Gregory Street) running along the west lot line to the point of intersection with the garage driveway; hence east to the southwest corner of the garage.

The Applicant also testified that a later date he would be seeking a variance to construct a fence from the northwest corner of the residence westerly to the west lot line; hence northerly to the northwest corner of the lot. Applicant could not state with specificity when this part of the project would commence.

Section 5.13(2) of the Zoning Code prohibits fences in front yards for lots locate in a R-1 Zone. Section 8.7(4) of the Zoning Code authorizes variations. After hearing the testimony and

considering the standards for issuing a variations the Zoning Board of Appeals entertained two motions. The first motion was to recommend that a variation be approved as to the Applicant's request for the construction of a six-foot wood or wood composite fence on the west lot line from the public alley to the garage driveway.

The votes were:

This motion having carried, we recommend that this part of the application be granted.

The second motion was to table the Applicant's request for a variance for the construction of a fence on the northern half of the west line to the northwest corner of the lot.

A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE CITY OF BLUE ISLAND, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS, A SUPPORTER OF WORKSITE BREASTFEEDING <u>ACCOMMODATION FOR CITY EMPLOYEES</u>

- WHEREAS, the City of Blue Island, Cook County, Illinois (the City) recognizes that breast milk is optimal food for growth and development of infants; and
- WHEREAS, the City recognizes that breastfeeding is associated with better maternal health outcomes; and
- WHEREAS, the City recognizes breastfeeding as an obesity prevention strategy endorsed by the Blue Island Model Community Program; and
- WHEREAS, the City acknowledges that both the State of Illinois and United States have passed laws to redress low breastfeeding rates and duration, including the social and workplace factors that can make it difficult for women to breastfeed; and
- WHEREAS, the City is on record as promoting and supporting breastfeeding and employees who breastfeed at work.
- **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** by the Mayor and City Council of the City of Blue Island, Cook County, Illinois as follows:
- **Section 1.** That the above recitals are hereby incorporated herein and made a part hereof, as if fully set forth in their entirety.
- **Section 2.** That the City will adopt a worksite policy to promote and support breastfeeding among city employees.
- **Section 3.** The City will provide a reasonable amount of time and appropriate space to accommodate an employee desiring to breastfeed.
- **Section 4.** Written complaints of a violation of this Resolution shall be received and investigated by the appropriate department head or supervisor in accordance with such complaint processing procedures established.
- **Section 5.** This Resolution shall not create or form the basis for liability on the part of the City in anyway, by any person, and that reliance by any person or party on any provision herein contained at their own risk, at all times.
- **Section 6.** This Resolution, and its parts, is declared to be severable and any section, clause, provision, or portion of this Resolution that is declared invalid shall not affect the validity of any other provision of this Resolution which shall remain in full force and effect.

ALLIED WASTE PROPOSAL

Mayor Peloquin reminded Council he had given them a copy of the proposal from Allied Waste in regards to the contract renewal and will present that to Council in the first meeting in February for approval and will tie this in with the water rate increase and will inform the residents on them both.

F.Y.I.

Mayor Peloquin informed Council they tried to finish most of the ERP streets and sidewalks. Canal Street in the 2nd Ward they have allocated extra funds from the Capital Bill, which is hopefully enough money to do the extra parking.

HOSPITAL SOLD

Mayor Peloquin informed Council that MetroSouth Hospital has accepted an offer to be purchased by Community Health Services Corporation out of Franklin Tennessee. It should be a smooth transition and everything will stay the same as it exists now. Their corporate structure is they own 131 hospitals in 29 states and will inform Council when he has more information. The deal

still has to be brought in front of the Illinois Health Facility Board, which will meet some time in February.

TIF CHECK

The Mayor informed Council that they are currently holding a check from the TIF fund, which was created for the hospital in the amount of \$650,000.00. The check would be held until we figure out where everything is with the new group.

QUESTIONS TO THE MAYOR

Ald. Vargas asked for an update on the Jewel Property.

The Mayor stated the Ordinances would be passed that night and are still on a timetable of finalizing the deal in mid March based on the corporate structure of Jewel. They are finalizing their agreement with Save-a-lot from the Jewel and negotiating their deal with Walgreens.

Ald. Janko asked if there were any more communications with the ownership and management of Modern Drop Forge.

Mayor Peloquin stated it was his understanding that they were moving ahead with their plans to move to Merriville as far as shutting down the plant and moving he has not had any contact with them as yet.

Ald. Johnson asked in regards to the new owners of the hospital, would their taxes be the same.

The Mayor stated their tax bill would be exactly what it is now. The group that is buying the hospital is a for profit organization.

Ald. Stone requested permission to approached the podium to present Jud Coyle from Angels touch with \$350 from all the Alderwomen of the City.

Jud Coyle thanked the Alderwomen and stated with the economy the way it is, this will make a big difference.

Ald. Thompson thanked everybody who contributed to help the people who were in the fire at the Vincennes Apartments.

Tony Lee thanked Ald. Thompson and stated he was glad to be there to help them.

Ald. Patoska asked if there was an update on Jawa and if any other municipalities joined.

The Mayor stated no, there hadn't been any contact yet.

Mayor Peloquin informed Council that Water Superintendent Werner brought to Mr. Anastasia and his attention that the street problem in front of the Blue Kangaroo Laundromat is a continual problem and IDOT does not seem to be doing anything about it. The Mayor authorized Superintendent Werner to go ahead and contract it out to fix the problem. The money will be coming out of the water fund to fix the problem before winter.

Ald. Patoska informed the Mayor that there are many streetlights that are out on Vermont Street.

The Mayor stated that Superintendent Stachulak is aware of it and has been working on that for the past week trying to figure out what the problem is.

Ald. Janko asked in regards to that repair, is there any way to charge IDOT.

Mayor Peloquin stated they're going to try to work it out.

Tee boxes on #2 and #4 were graded and seeded. #10 has been leveled off and seeded. All fall projects have been completed. Preventative maintenance on equipment are being conducted and budgets are being discussed for next year. Mr. Vidovic reported the receipts reported for the month of November was \$46,949.81.

Water Superintendent Werner reported that catch basin cleanings throughout the city were completed approximately about 120. Equipment is now arriving for booster pump station upgrades. Upgrades to Vincennes station have been made are working extremely well. Highland station should be upgraded within the next two weeks. Data recording equipment will be up graded as well. Hydrant testing throughout the City has been completed (M.E. Simpson). The Superintendent reported that delinquent water accounts have been reduced. He will report back to the Committee on the status of "On Line Bill Pay" as he did not have an update at the time of the meeting. He is working with CSX and the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District on a project at California and Union Street to handle run off storm water from the railway right of way. He is also working with Robinson Engineering in identifying an area bordered by 119th Longwood Drive and Vincennes to 122nd and providing an alternate route for storm water run off in a catastrophic storm to relieve storm sewers in that Robinson Engineering has identified this area as a "low grade". He is working on a grant for pervious paving and rain barrels. This area may be best served by the grant. He reported that EPA requirements for phase 2 water testing. This has been completed and will be a once a year sampling. Water meter replacement is still ongoing; the department is averaging 4-meter changes a day.

Public Works Superintendent Ken Stachulak reported that the department has been through the entire city 4 times with leaf removal. Almost all of the equipment has been converted for snow removal equipment has been received preventative maintenance and is ready to go. They will pick up leaves placed in yard waste containers placed on the parkway. The salt supply stands at 500 tons in the dome and a total of 900 tons on site. Union Street and Deer Point projects have been completed. The 16 block street resurfacing and 7th Ward sidewalks should be completed within the next week. Urban Forestry Board is attending and EAB grant hosted by South Suburban Mayors & Managers in Hazel Crest, they hope get funding for tree replacements. IDOT is going to be working on the Western Avenue bridge they will not be closing the bridge completely. He did indicate that they would also be adding Bike Lanes to the roadway.

Citizens addressing the Committee -

Ron Young addressed the Committee regarding the JAWA project that is being investigated by the City of Blue Island. Superintendent Werner explained to him that it was in its earliest stages of feasibility and that no "hard" information is involved at this earliest of stages. Ald. Spizzirri reported that there was a public hearing. Mr. Young was not aware of it.

A resident living next to Northern Lumber off of 127th Street attended the meeting and asked if there were any provisions made to the parking lot that is going in there. He requested from Ald. Vargas if he can investigate 2 or 3 spots in that parking lot to be assigned the residents there. Ald. Janko told him to contact Ald. Vargas regarding this.
