**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF BLUE ISLAND, COOK COUNTY,
ILLINOIS, AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING AN AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE
CITY AND ENTERPRISE FLEET MANAGEMENT**

WHEREAS, the City of Blue Island, Cook County, Illinois (the “City”) is a duly organized and existing City created under the provisions of the laws of the State of Illinois and operating under the provisions of the Illinois Municipal Code, and all laws amendatory thereof and supplementary thereto, with full powers to enact ordinances and adopt resolutions for the benefits of the residents of the City; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to enter into a contract with Enterprise Fleet Management for the leasing of certain vehicles for the Police Department, as detailed by the Chief of Police.

WHEREAS, the Mayor and Aldermen of the City of Blue Island deem it advisable and in the best interests of the health, safety and welfare of the residents of the City to enter into this Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Mayor and the Aldermen of the City of Blue Island, Cook County, Illinois as follows:

Section 1. That the above recitals and legislative findings are found to be true and correct and are hereby incorporated herein and made a part hereof, as if fully set forth in their entirety.

Section 2. That the Mayor and Aldermen find and determine that the adoption of this Resolution is in the best interests of the City as well as in the best interests of the public.

Section 3. The officials and officers of the City are hereby authorized to undertake actions on the part of the City as contained in the Agreement to complete satisfaction of the provisions, terms or conditions stated therein.

Section 4. If any section, paragraph, clause or provision of this Resolution shall be held invalid, the invalidity thereof shall not affect any other provision of this Resolution.

Section 5. All ordinances, resolutions, motions or orders in conflict with this Resolution are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.


Section 6. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its passage, approval, and publication as required by law.



Re: Enterprise Fleet Management Vehicle Selection

Council Action: Motion

Request for Committee Action: Motion to approve the lease of ten (10) vehicles through Enterprise Fleet.

Overview: An analysis of the Blue Island Police Department reveals several deficiencies in the existing fleet in regards to the quality of the current fleet and the quantity of vehicles in use. The current administration, which would utilize three vehicles, is currently operating with two. Those vehicles are a 2013 Dodge Durango with over 125,000 miles, and a 2013 Ford Police Interceptor Utility with approximately 80,000. The Detective Division, which consists of five investigators, with an additional position opening in 2022, currently has four vehicles used for covert operations and day-to-day assignments. Of those four vehicles, three are 2020 model years, while one is a 2011 Ford Edge, with over 120,000 miles.

Lastly, the Patrol Division requires at a minimum, 16 vehicles to operate safely and efficiently. Currently, the Patrol Division fleet is comprised of:

- (1) 2020 Ford Police Interceptor Utility
- (3) 2019 Ford Police Interceptor Utilities
- (1) 2019 Ford Police Interceptor Sedan
- (2) 2017 Ford Police Interceptor Utilities
- (2) 2017 Ford Police Interceptor Sedans
- (1) 2015 Ford Police Interceptor Utility
- (1) 2015 Ford Police Interceptor Sedan
- (2) 2013 Ford Police Interceptor Utility*
- (2) 2013 Ford Police Interceptor Sedans*
- (1) 2000 GMC Savanna Transport Van
 - *Indicates over 125,000 miles

Twelve vehicles are assigned on a full-time basis to full-time, sworn officers working on the (4) 12-hour shifts. The School Resource Officer is assigned a vehicle to be used while school is in session and special events outside of school hours. There are 2 "pool" vehicles used when a full-time vehicle is down for repair, and one prisoner transport van.

MEMORANDUM

Options and Recommendation: The BIPD recommends the selection of the following vehicles from the Enterprise Vehicle Selector, which the BIPD can take possession of in 2021, with minimal financial impact to COBI, as the BIPD appropriated funds for vehicle purchases has not been used.

- (1) Chevrolet Blazer
 - \$7,277.76 annually, \$606.48 monthly
 - Cost includes \$5,000 in equipment

- (5) Chevrolet Malibu
 - \$4,662.96 each annually, \$388.58 each monthly
 - Cost includes \$5,000 in equipment for each vehicle

*Total prorated cost (Oct., Nov., & Dec.) for all seven vehicles is \$7,648.14

** Total annual cost for all six vehicles is \$30,592.56

The mixture of vehicles selected allow the Administration and Detective Division to have flexibility in the vehicles used for covert operations, as well as support vehicles for special events such as National Night Out, Fireworks at the Falls, and Trunk-or-Treat.

Additionally, the BIPD recommends the selection of four (4) 2022 Ford Police Interceptor Utility Vehicles, which if ordered in October 2021 would not see a delivery date for approximately 36 weeks. COBI would not be responsible for any payments until delivery.

- (4) Ford Interceptors
 - \$9,609.72 each annually, \$800.81 each monthly
 - Cost includes \$10,000 in equipment for each vehicle.

*Assuming delivery is made in July 2022, total prorated cost for the Interceptors is \$19,219.44

** Total annual cost for all Interceptors is \$38,438.88

Financial Impact: Budgeted

Motion: Approve selection of aforementioned vehicles for use in the police department fleet.
