#### g. Mayor's Announcements.

The Mayor stated that the City applied for a \$3 million State of Illinois grant for streetscaping set to begin in August 2022.

The Mayor informed the Aldermen that the Interim Fire Chief is applying for a federal grant to assist with the purchase of an additional fire truck. Interim Chief Haywood was able to gather letters from Congressman Rush and Durbin to support the grant application.

The Mayor informed the Aldermen that the City also applied for a grant to replace all lighting within municipal buildings that is intended to cover 80% of the upgrade cost.

The Mayor stated the Forestry Board held a meeting and reported that they have successfully received grants and have a strategy for this summer.

The Mayor informed Aldermen that the construction on Olde Western is set to begin once IDOT approves it.

The Mayor informed the Aldermen that an ice cream parlor has expressed interest in a storefront on Olde Western.

The Mayor mentioned that the Lyric Theater's construction is progressing, and they hope to be open by summer or fall 2022.

The Mayor informed Council that while the administration was reviewing records in relation to an IRMF issue, it came to his attention that in 1998 the City employed 253 people. Today, the City employees approximately 180 people. He expressed his opinion that the City is doing more work with less people, just like other municipalities.

The Mayor thanked everyone for their excellent work on handling the first snow fall. He informed the Aldermen that the City lost three trucks; but Public Works had them fixed and they are now up and running. However, the City still needs new equipment. The trucks ordered previously likely will not arrive until 2023; and so, the administration is speaking with IDOT and other agencies regarding the potential need to lease trucks in the future.

The Mayor stated the liquor license are up-to-date and during the process of license renewal, the City determined that one of the taverns has been paying sales taxes to Alsip instead of Blue island. The staff is looking into a remedy.

The Mayor stated that Burke Engineering has finished its initial draft survey of street conditions. You can find the map at the Clerk's office.

The Mayor stated that Chicago Fire will be filming the last week of the month on Western Avenue bridge. They are waiting on permission from IDOT.

The Mayor stated that the City is planning to renegotiating its lease with MWRD.

The Mayor stated he attended the police and fire union meetings and that he updated the alderman individually regarding the same.

City Clerk Raeann Cantelo-Zylman informed the Alderman that she is working on bringing a Christmas Tree Farm back to Blue Island.

City Clerk Raeann Cantelo-Zylman informed the Aldermen that she is considering starting a Hometown Hero program, similar to neighboring communities, to honor the veterans and current members of the armed forces living in Blue Island.

City Clerk-Raeann Cantelo-Zylman informed us the Clerk's office will be closed in the observance of Martin Luther King holiday.

City Clerk-Raeann Cantelo-Zylman wished all Blue Island Police a happy Law Enforcement Appreciation Day.
